The success of Pathways to Excellence within the Chicagoland network prompted CLEF to pilot the program across Lutheran schools in the Midwest. Principal 360, created and reformatted for virtual delivery, empowers Lutheran School Principals as they sharpen every skill they need for every issue they face. Today's schools need 21st century platforms to regain equilibrium and remain sustainable. Lutheran school enrollment must reverse current trends and rise. Astute leaders will leverage new perspectives for mission and vision, curriculum, staff passion, market analysis, fundraising, and marketing. Who is best suited to command this new trajectory of success and brighter horizons? The Principal.

CLEF takes pride in launching the first professional development initiative that offers a comprehensive toolkit to help faithbased principals. Principal 360 is unlike traditional professional development or university-based programming. It is an online leadership program specifically designed for Lutheran school

leaders. Principals from Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, and Missouri were selected to participate in the first round of Principal 360.

The highly-focused leadership program includes a full-year course taught by outstanding instructors from across the country. Every principal is provided a personal, seasoned leadership coach to guide and facilitate coursework and the completion of a strategic plan. Participation in the program also includes three in-person "Member Meet-Up" events. These specially designed events provide instructor-led course content, meaningful one-on-one time with coaches, and opportunities to deepen professional friendships among principals. Full-circle success for every member is at the forefront of Principal 360.

Principal 360 is a dynamic 21st century educational tapestry that weaves the best practices of the past with the evolving best practices of today. In a nutshell, Principal 360 is leadership program that listens, adapts, and acts. Principals from this program will not only gain the knowledge and leadership base, but through support, guidance and direction, become innovative thought leaders who transform the trajectory of their school.

In the Midst of a Pandemic... A Success Story

I started working with D. last year when he was in the fourth grade. He had moved to Chicago from another state and enrolled at Holy Family School. He could read aloud at grade level, but didn't understand what he had read. We worked on improving his vocabulary and reading comprehension. He was doing very well. Then the school building closed in March due to the pandemic.

Using contributions from CLEF's Special Education Fund, I was able to immediately continue my sessions with D. over remote learning. During our first sessions, we used FaceTime to complete schoolwork. In a couple of weeks, he was able to get a computer and I taught him how to log onto school sites and complete work online. After several sessions, he was adept at using a computer for his schoolwork. This occurred because of the Special Education Fund. The Chicago Public Schools did not give CLEF permission to use its IDEA money for special education services until three weeks before the end of the school year.

The Special Education Fund also enabled us to provide summer services for special education students so they could catch up with their peers. While D. spent the summer out of state with his mother, I continued virtual learning sessions with him. Even though he worked in a clothes closet so his little sisters wouldn't bother him, he made good progress in vocabulary and reading comprehension.

Both his mother and father repeatedly thanked me and are happy with their son's improvement. They said D. really loves Holy Family and, despite financial challenges, enrolled him there this year. I am excited to work with him some more and see his continued growth.



Keeping CLEF Schools Open for SAFE Learning

The occurrence of COVID-19 pandemic has threatened the health of our communities, education, teachers, staff, students, and families. Our CLEF schools have worked hard to sustain educational goals for their students who often had to balance family obligations. Our schools have remained open, the majority in-person and in classrooms. Most CLEF schools offered remote or hybrid learning options as needed.



Opening schools generally does not significantly increase community transmission of COVID-19, particularly when guidance outlined by the World Health Organization (WHO),¹ United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), and

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is followed. The lower risk of transmission of the virus by younger children and reported milder or moderate illness in this age group suggest the appropriateness of in-person instruction for primary and elementary grades. Along with colleagues in the field of education, the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) strongly advocates for in-person instruction for the health of children if it occurs in a safe environment. We all want to see children in our schools develop and grow to their potential.

The majority of our schools' staff have been vaccinated at this time. It is extremely important to build herd immunity and receive the vaccine when available. We must realize that a vaccine for children will be unlikely (or at least based on present data) until the very end of the school year (June).

The pandemic will end. Our CLEF schools and personnel have established and done a tremendous job in providing a safe, healthy environment in the school setting for educating. This can or will not be able to continue without school, parent, and community support. We ALL have the responsibility to give children hope and the best opportunity to learn to their potential in a safe, stable and healthy environment.
