For 2 years my class had the opportunity to participate in the Superheroes program with "Nurse Pat" and "Dr. Steve." Superheroes is a program that strengthens both the minds and hearts of students as well as teachers through classroom instruction by Nurse Pat for our students and Zoom meetings with Dr. Steve for the teachers.

Once a week for about 8 weeks my students waited with excited anticipation for Nurse Pat to walk in and empty her crate, giving them a hint of what they would be learning for that day. We discussed various science and health topics like understanding our feelings, washing hands, brushing teeth, getting the right amount of sleep, and exercising.

Nurse Pat ended every session with song, dance, and exercise. I loved seeing the smiles on their faces when she would say, "Stand up" because they knew what would follow. My class met for Superheroes on Tuesdays. One morning a student stood up and declared, "Today is Tuesday, and Tuesday means Superheroes! I love Tuesdays!" I knew I made the right choice in signing up back in August for another session of Superheroes. Another student came to school to tell me that he had his mom make copies of his teeth brushing chart because "dental health is important for everyone, Mrs. Gus. Nurse Pat said so."

My favorite part of Superheroes must be the last day of class when the students get to dress up in capes and masks. For days they ask to wear them. They all choose different superheroes with different powers but all strike that pose with their fisted hands on their hips and legs spread eagle looking into the distance. If I had a superpower, it would be to know the lyrics to every song. When I am with my family in the car and the radio is on, there is usually laughter as I have no idea what I am singing. Admit it, you have all been there at least a few times in your life.

Around the World with St. Philip Lutheran School!

Each year, CLEF invites teachers at all CLEF schools to apply for the Dream Grant, which allows teachers to dream big about experiences or supplies which will enhance the academic curriculum, the school environment, or the positive culture of the school. Teachers articulate their dreams, write proposals and budgets, then look forward to the Teacher Dream Awards Dinner in May, when the winners are announced.

St. Philip teacher Kelley Schau took the challenge, and devised a plan for a wonderful year-long trip around the world via field trips, cultural experiences, and food! Every month, a different country is featured - each representative of the background of some of St. Philip's students. Teachers guide students through fun activities, appropriate to grade level, so that students learn about the country of the month. At the end, a culminating activity is enjoyed by all students in Grades PreK – 8th Grade!

So far, the St. Philip community has enjoyed a trip to the Puerto Rican Museum, a homemade German lunch to commemorate the Reformation, as well as tasty cuisine from Mexico. Trips to the nearby Swedish Museum, the DuSable Museum, and the Ukrainian Museum are planned, as well as experiences with the culture and cuisine from China and Greece. This year-long experience will culminate with a Family Cultural Celebration with all of the St. Philip community!

Principal Donna Tennis reports that the kids are all excited each month when they learn which country will be featured next. Colorful flags festoon St. Philip's hallways, as a reminder of the countries and cultures they have studied. "The Dream Award is just the latest reason for all of us to be grateful to CLEF! As I was showing her around the classrooms and catching up with her, she saw an All God's People Sing hymnal on a bookshelf and said how she remembers singing songs from it. I offered her a copy and she had tears in her eyes as she accepted that gift.

Friends abound here, and one such friend is Dr. Patricia Braun. She is a SuperHero who students from pre-kindergarten through 8th grade recognize as their friend. This year not only did our students participate in CLEF SuperHero Program, our middle school students benefited from the CLEF Student Awareness Program. All subjects covered hit the target on teaching and discussing what older students need to be aware of in handling emotions, to knowledge about internet safety. Pilgrim won the Lincoln Square Apple Fest contest, securing them a free door hanger marketing campaign in the area. Grace Christian served 100 conchas and 75 cups of coffee to families at their Conchas and Coffee event in front of the school. And Walther's fall open house had 32 prospective families in attendance! All of our AMCs are diligently working towards their goals of bringing more families to their schools!

The November AMC professional development session was led by Linda Fox, Bethany Lutheran's Admissions Director, and was a huge hit with our AMCs! Linda's presentation focused on best practices and tips for leading school tours. She facilitated a great conversation, and our AMCs took away many new ideas to implement in their tours. In addition, each AMC will tour another CLEF school in the coming months to learn from each other and generate ideas to bring back to their own school.

Our AMCs have made great strides towards improving their marketing materials this fall. St. Paul Dorchester, Grace Christian, and St. John's are securing new exterior banners. St. Philip is upgrading their tour folder, and Grace Christian and Saint Luke are working to obtain new yard signs. CLEF hired a film crew to create a virtual tour at Walther, and the finishing touches are currently being made on this project. I have also been working with St. Paul Austin to identify the school's marketing needs, and they now have a new school logo and will soon have an updated brochure and exterior banners.

As peak enrollment season quickly approaches this spring, our AMCs are doing everything they can to help retain students through Kindergarten Nights, mentor program events, and informational meetings for families. They are also brainstorming new ways to engage prospective families by rethinking open houses and their school's admission process. I am looking forward to the positive changes that will be made during the 2024 enrollment season!
