

PATHWAYS TO EXCELLENCE LEADERSHIP SKILLS FOR 21ST CENTURY SCHOOLS



Lutheran schools today face complex challenges and exciting opportunities. For schools to be successful, our principals and teachers must be equipped to meet the demands of these changing times. CLEF is committed to supporting our Lutheran principals and teachers by providing training and resources to help them enhance their leadership skills, becoming more effective leaders in their schools, classrooms, and communities.

Through the very generous support of Dean and Rosemarie Buntrock, CLEF launched its "Pathways to Excellence" quality initiative. This leadership training program for CLEF principals and teachers is designed to build the school management, classroom management and leadership skills necessary to foster and maintain sustainable, high-quality Lutheran educational environments. Increased enrollment in Chicagoland Lutheran schools is expected to be a key outcome of the Pathways program. CLEF has benefited from collaboration with two of our Community Partners to execute this plan – Concordia University Chicago and Davidoff Mission-Driven Business Strategy.

Pathways to Excellence is a three-year leadership training and skill-building program. During the first year, principals participated in a 10-month curriculum with content geared towards teaching practical skills necessary to generate actionable plans for their schools. The culmination of the first year was completion of a school strategic plan focused on enhancing quality and reaching school improvement goals. Years two and three focus on intensive mentoring and coaching with a team of education experts who are assisting teachers and leaders in implementing their plans.

Pathways to Excellence focuses on three main initiatives:

- Strategic Strength & Management: including best practices for strategy, operations, administration, marketing, community engagement, fundraising, enrollment, facilities and other knowledge areas essential to running a school, or managing a classroom
- Educational Best Practices: covering topics such as curriculum development, academic standards, student achievement, professional development and other themes specific to maintaining a high-quality educational experience
- Leadership & Interpersonal Empowerment: focusing on "soft skills" for leaders such as building rapport, principles of leadership, communication styles, personality styles, social and emotional intelligence, personal and organizational transformation

The Pathways to Excellence program features:

- Classroom Instruction: Monthly classroom instruction for principals and regular literacy-based classroom instruction for teachers
- Individualized coaching/mentoring in and outside of the classroom for principals and teachers
- · Applied assignments that build immediate skills
- Peer-to-peer learning
- Online community/classroom portal
- Personalized assessments for each participant and his/her school
- Quarterly progress reports
- Access to expert support and coaching
- · Access to an instructional technology coach
- Access to a digital media expert to support enrollment and marketing at the school level
- · Access to a special education coordinator

The Pathways to Excellence program benefits our schools through:

- Customized strategic improvement plan
- · Pathways to improving overall school quality and success
- Individualized development plan
- Practical knowledge that can be applied immediately
- Enhanced leadership and classroom skills
- Eligibility for a stipend upon completion of the program

CLEF SCHOOLS PROFILE



The Core of Grace Christian Academy

Grace Christian Academy has been serving the students and families of Chicago's Little Village area for over 120 years. Grace's mission is to prepare students for success in high school, college, and beyond, raising them up to be future Christian leaders in service

to God and their communities.

In its continued mission to prepare students for success, Grace Christian, through CLEF initiatives, is armed with the latest technology to aid children in their studies. Every student attending Grace has access to a Google Chromebook as a supplemental learning tool for in-class instruction. Students also use iPads to access their eSpark Learning program, which provides ongoing academic support at their individual levels. Each classroom is equipped with an interactive SMART Board to facilitate collaborative learning. Principal Carlo Giannotta stated teachers and students are "excited and very pleased" with the technology and are looking for innovative ways to incorporate new devices into the classroom. The school is also blessed by longstanding support from the Perkins Malo Hunter Foundation and its commitment to urban education. Generous financial assistance from Perkins has provided Grace with an instructional coach, as well as a scholarship fund, keeping tuition affordable for Grace families.

Grace Christian has no Ds in their grading system, only As, Bs, Cs, and Fs. The school wants to instill a higher level of work ethic and better studying habits. Having a stricter grade scale pushes students for even higher excellence and teaches them the valuable lesson of capitalizing on the opportunities given to them. Seventy percent of Grace Christian Academy's students made the honor roll this past quarter. In addition to a strong academic program, Grace offers many extra-curriculars for their students. These include athletic teams (volleyball, basketball and track), a band program (grades 4-8), The Grace Notes Choir, Drama Club (grades K-8) and Girls on the Run, a curriculumbased program to inspire girls to be healthy and confident while creatively involving running in each lesson.

Grace Christian Academy prides itself on being family oriented. Principal Giannotta stated, "The strength of our school is the community." He went on to say that "Eighty-five percent of our students come from Hispanic families. The very essence of Hispanic culture is the importance of family. Our staff does everything in our power to emulate such important traits and values cultivating our students to develop and thrive."

TWO CLEF PRINCIPALS ARE VAN LUNEN FELLOWS

The Van Lunen Center for Executive Management in Christian Schools at Calvin College was created to provide top-notch management education for Christian schools. Each year up to 24 heads of Christian schools throughout the world meet to foster and grow their executive skills. Two CLEF principals were selected as fellows. Dr. Robyn Jacks-DuBose of St. Paul Evangelical Lutheran School on Dorchester and Mr. Carlo Giannotta of Grace Christian Academy participated in this yearlong initiative.

The Van Lunen Fellows program launched with a conference that brought together twenty-four individuals whose only commonality was their roles as leaders of Christian schools. By the end of the week, they transformed into twenty-four colleagues who worshiped together, commiserated with each other, revitalized one another and developed lasting relationships. The five days of intensive training focused on effective school management, and covered everything from school culture to being visionaries in strategic planning. It was a week-long discussion of Christian values, the uniqueness of Christian schools and reflection on best practices. "The Van Lunen Program helped me to develop my strengths and identify areas of improvement. It was an uplifting experience," said Dr. Jacks-DuBose.

During the conference, school leaders were invited to participate in a question and answer forum with a group of four donors. After the session a donor challenged the Fellows to record a one-minute video about their school and what they were most passionate about. Twenty out of the 24 accepted the challenge and recorded their videos later that same afternoon We are delighted to share that when the results were announced the following morning, CLEF principal Dr. Jacks-DuBose was awarded \$5,000 for her school.

Mr. Giannotta and Dr. Jacks-DuBose continued with the program throughout the year including in-person collaboration and development of school-specific strategic plans which they presented in July. CLEF extends our thanks to our Chairman Jay Christopher for sponsoring such a wonderful opportunity for these two principals and their school communities.
